Taiwo Ajai-Lycett OON

ACTOR, journalist, television presenter, and cosmetologist, Dame Taiwo Ajai-Lycett is a matriarch of the Nigeria actors' family. Her career on stage and screen has spanned over six decades, and is only one of very few in her class and age to remain evergreen and active on stage and on screen. She is also a foremost art advocate and a leading voice for cultural renaissance. She founded the TAL Institute, dedicated to training and mentoring younger creative talents in various disciplines of the arts.

Kayode Victor Aderinokun

BUSINESSMAN, Culture activist, poet, author of the collection, *Inferno in the Rain*, Chief Aderinokun served as chairman of the Association of Nigerian Authors, ANA Lagos Chapter. Also, a columnist, he was a regular contributor to national newspapers in Nigeria in the 80s through the 90s. Educated both in Nigeria and the United States, he is a successful businessman with interest in banking, mining and commerce. **Chairman of First Marina Trust Limited**, he currently serves as a cofounder, leading shareholder of Tropical Mines Limited and Segilola Resources Operating Limited, as well as Chairman of FMT Prime Ltd.

Iyabo Aboaba

ASTUTE professional arts manager and culture advocate, Iyabo Aboaba's career has spanned over 40 years in varied industries. She was Production manager with the leading film production of the 70s, Francis Oladele-led Calpenny Film, during which she worked on the set of *Kongi's Harvest*, among other productions. She was, for 17 years the Admin and Human Resources Manager for Roxburg and Partners, a firm of Quantity Surveyors and for Design Group Nigeria, a firm of Architects. She later served for over a decade as a manager at the Musical society of Nigeria (MUSON) Centre, Onikan. She has been Chief Operation Officer of the prime art production and expression centre, Lagos Freedom Park, for over a decade.

<u>Ben Tomoloju</u>

DRAMATIST, theatre producer and director, music composer and Culture Communicator, Ben Tomoloju, popularly known as Ben T, is revered as doyen of arts and culture journalism in Nigeria. Former Leader Writer with Punch newspaper, and later, Literary Editor of `, he was the pioneer Arts & Literary Editor of *The Guardian* from 1984; and retired as Deputy Editor of the medium in 1992. Founder of the famous Kakaaki Arts Kompany, his plays have been widely produced at home and abroad, and they include *Jankariwo*, *Mujemuje*, *Askari*, *Amona*, *Iphigenia finds Aiyelala* and others, while his secular and spiritual songs are frequently played on radio and in churches.

Chinwe Uwatse

PAINTER from the abstract Uli style of the Nsukka School, Chinwe is also an astute culture administrator, who spent years as a curator with the National Council for Arts and Culture, NCAC, in the 90s. Her works have been featured in many exhibitions worldwide including at the Brunei Gallery in London, the LeRoy Neiman Art Center in New York, the Windspiel Gallery in Vienna and Arthouse Contemporary in Lagos. She is also an executive manager of corporate institutions.

<u>Toyin Akinosho</u>

EARTH Scientist and passionate art and culture promoter, Akinosho worked as Petroleum Geologist with Chevron Nigeria Limited between July 1988 and February 2008. He started his working life as a reporter with *The Guardian* newspaper, where he once served as State House correspondent. He later worked with *Thisweek* magazine before joining the Chevron. An avid arts writer and critic with popular columns in various major newspapers, in 1991 he led the group of five activists, to initiate the idea of the Committee for Relevant Art, CORA, which is now the leading culture advocacy body in the country. He is the publisher/editor-in-chief of the *Africa Oil+Gas Report, AOGR* as well as the *BookArtville.com*.

Jahman Oladejo Anikulapo

TRAINED theatre artiste, journalist and culture activist, he began his art journalism career at *The Guardian*, rising to become the arts and media

editor in 1993, and in 2003, he was redeployed to edit the Sunday title, from where he retired from formal newsroom operation in 2013. Side by side his journalism career, he also had a full career as an actor and director on stage and screen and traveled widely in the country and in Europe. He founded the Culture Advocates Caucus, through which he has curated and produced various programmes and projects locally and internationally. Pascal Ott

FAMOUSLY revered as the most active 'Cultural Diplomat' in Lagos creative sphere because of his passion for, and contribution to the local culture production scene, Pascal Ott, fondly called 'Uncle Pascal', arrived in Ilorin Kwara State Nigeria in 1982 as a teacher; and arrived Lagos in 1993 and worked as Programme Director with the French Cultural Centre. He is renowned for his contribution to the take-off and/or development of the careers of many musical, theatrical and visual artists who are today international stars and accomplished professionals in their various fields.

Chris Ihidero

FILMMAKER, journalist, broadcaster trained as a theatre artiste at the Lagos State University. He became a part of the CORA family even while still in school as a member of the Optimum Consult, CORA's partner production company. He was deployed in 2005 to help produce the Best of Broadcast TV (BoBTv) with the Amaka Igwe Studio. He later became an executive of the Studio, during which he directed many episodes of *Fuji House of Commotion*, and also served as Executive of Top Radio founded by the late Amaka Igwe. He has since gone on to become a major TV and movie producer.

<u>Deji Toye</u>

ENTERPRISE lawyer with expertise and engagements in finance, energy, TME (technology, media and entertainment) as well as corporate governance/sustainability, Deji is also a playwright, gifted cartoonist and public intellectual with regular contribution t public discourse. Bolanle Austen-Peters

LAWYER turned theatre and movie director and producer as well as creative entrepreneur, Bolanle is the founder and artistic director of BAP Productions and the CEO of the foremost arts and culture center, Terra Kulture in Lagos. She worked for years as a lawyer with the United Nations' High Commission for Refugees, and left to found the Terra Kulture, which soon became the foremost arts and culture centre in Nigeria. Executive Producer and artistic director of BAP Productions, among her film credits are: 93 Days, Bling Lagosians, Collision Course Man of God etc. Her theatre credits include *Saro, Wakaa, Fela and the Kalakuta Queens, Man Enough* among others

Teju Kareem fta

MULTIMEDIA stage designer and sceneographer, Teju is a consummate theatre professional and creative entrepreneur, who lifted technical theatre to enviable level.
